THE HONORABLE BARNETT E. HOFFMAN, RETIRED PJSC—PRESIDED OVER THREE HUNDRED AND TWENTY JURY TRIALS INCLUDING FIFTY HOMICIDE CASES AND TEN CAPITAL CASES IN THE SUPERIOR COURT, CRIMINAL DIVISION. HE WAS THE FIRST ASSISTANT PROSECUTOR IN MIDDLESEX COUNTY FROM 1978-1981. JUDGE HOFFMAN WAS APPOINTED BY GOVERNOR JAMES MCGREEVEY TO THE NEW JERSEY SENTENCING COMMISSION IN MARCH, 2004 AND ELECTED CHAIR IN JULY, 2004.

HARRY KAZMAN—AUTHOR/PRODUCER/DIRECTOR—HAS WON NUMEROUS DIRECTING AND ACTING AWARDS FOR HIS PRODUCTIONS. THE TRIAL OF THE CENTURY HAD ITS PREMIERE IN 1990. HARRY'S SECOND PLAY, THE CHANGEWATER MURDER TRIALS, PREMIERED AT THE HISTORIC COURTHOUSE IN BELVIDERE, NJ IN 1995. THE HALL-MILLS MURDER TRIAL PREMIERED AT THE HISTORIC SOMERSET COUNTY COURTHOUSE IN SOMERVILLE, NJ IN THE FALL OF 1997. HIS NEWEST PLAY, CONSPIRACY: THE TRIAL OF THE ROSENBERGS, WILL HAVE ITS WORLD PREMIERE IN MAY, 2008.

JAY LANGLEY — EDITOR, HUNTERDON COUNTY DEMOCRAT— STARTED AS A CUB REPORTER AT THE HUNTERDON COUNTY DEMOCRAT NEWSPAPER IN 1970, BECOMING EDITOR IN 1988. ALONG THE WAY HE QUIT ONCE AND GOT FIRED ONCE. HE AND HIS WIFE CATHERINE SUPPORT AND VOLUNTEER FOR MANY COMMUNITY NON-PROFIT ORGANIZATIONS. AMONG THEIR AVOCATIONS ARE TEACHING WHITewater CANOEING AND GROWING BLUEBERRIES, RASPBERRIES, ASPARAGUS AND CHERRY TOMATOES.

RICHARD POMPELIO, Esq. —VICTIM'S RIGHTS ADVOCATE—BEGAN PRACTICING LAW IN NEW JERSEY IN 1972. FOR OVER HALF OF HIS CAREER, HIS WORK HAS BEEN DEVOTED TO ASSISTING CRIME VICTIMS IN THE CRIMINAL JUSTICE SYSTEM. ON FEBRUARY 12, 1989, RICHARD'S 17 YEAR OLD SON, TONY, WAS MURDERED. IN 1992, RICHARD ESTABLISHED THE NEW JERSEY CRIME VICTIMS' LAW CENTER, WHICH IS DEDICATED TO THE *PRO BONO* REPRESENTATION OF CRIME VICTIMS IN THE CRIMINAL JUSTICE SYSTEM.

ANTHONY M. ROTUNNO, Esq. — IS A PARTNER IN THE FLEMINGTON LAW FIRM OF KUCHINSKY AND ROTUNNO, P.C. HE PRACTICES IN THE AREAS OF CRIMINAL AND CIVIL LITIGATION IN BOTH IN THE FEDERAL AND STATE COURTS OF NEW JERSEY. MR. ROTUNNO IS A CO-CHAIR OF THE CRIMINAL PRACTICE COMMITTEE OF THE HUNTERDON COUNTY BAR ASSOCIATION. HE IS THE COUNTY BAR ASSOCIATION REPRESENTATIVE ON THE SPEEDY TRIAL COMMITTEE FOR THE SUPERIOR COURT OF NEW JERSEY, HUNTERDON COUNTY.

DEBBIE LOCKWOOD (ANNA HAUPTMANN) TEACHES LANGUAGE ARTS TO 8TH GRADERS AT GREAT MEADOWS MIDDLE SCHOOL. SHE MET HER HUSBAND, BILL NUTT, WHEN THEY WERE CAST IN DOVER LITTLE THEATER'S A STREET-CAR NAMED DESIRE. THEY HAVE SINCE APPEARED TOGETHER IN SEVERAL SHOWS, INCLUDING WHO'S AFRAID OF VIRGINIA WOOLF AT COUNTRY GATE. SHE APPEARED IN THE PREMIERE PRODUCTION OF THE CHANGEWATER MURDER TRIALS, AND CREATED THE ROLE OF THE PIG WOMAN IN THE HALL-MILLS MURDER TRIAL. SHE IS ENJOYING HER ELEVENTH SEASON WITH THIS TRIAL.

BILL NUTT (BRUNO HAUPTMANN) APPEARS AS BRUNO FOR THE SEVENTH YEAR. HE TEACHES GIFTED AND TALENTED STUDENTS FOR THE GREAT MEADOWS REGIONAL SCHOOL DISTRICT, AND HAS APPEARED WITH HIS WIFE, THE LOVELY DEBBIE LOCKWOOD, IN SEVERAL PRODUCTIONS. IN 1995, HE STARRED IN THE PREMIERE PRODUCTION OF HARRY KAZMAN'S THE CHANGEWATER MURDER TRIALS, AND PLAYED PROSECUTOR ALEXANDER SIMPSON IN THE HALL-MILLS MURDER TRIAL. HE IS THRILLED TO BE PLAYING DEBBIE'S HUSBAND IN THIS PRODUCTION.

ED SCOTT (EDWARD REILLY, ESQ.) RETURNS FOR HIS FIFTEENTH SEASON AS "BIG ED" REILLY, THE ROLE HE CREATED IN OUR ORIGINAL PRODUCTION. ED BELIEVES HE'S NOW SPENT MORE TIME IN THIS COURTROOM THAN THE REAL EDWARD REILLY. PREVIOUS EXPERIENCES INCLUDE PRODUCTIONS OF THE MISER, MACBETH, OUR TOWN, GOD'S TROMBONES AND THE DOCUMENTARY IN WHITE AMERICA. AS A HISTORY BUFF, ED ENJOYS THE CHALLENGE OF BRINGING HISTORY TO LIFE THROUGH THIS PRODUCTION. HE IS A RESIDENT OF RARITAN TOWNSHIP.


KEVIN YOUNG (ATTORNEY GENERAL DAVID WILENTZ) RETURNS FOR HIS FIFTEENTH YEAR AS THE RELENTLESS PROSECUTOR, IN THE ROLE HE CREATED FOR THE ORIGINAL PRODUCTION. KEVIN HAS APPEARED IN NUMEROUS PRODUCTIONS IN NEW JERSEY AND CONNECTICUT, INCLUDING EDWARD RUTLEDGE IN 1776 AND JUDD FRYE IN OKLAHOMA FOR PLAYS IN THE PARK IN EDISON, AND U.S. GRANT IN BRUCE SERLINS'S APPOMATTOX. HE IS AN AVID HISTORY BUFF, AND A SERGEANT OF A REVOLUTIONARY WAR REGIMENT, THE 2ND NEW JERSEY, WHICH RE-ENACTS AUTHENTIC ENCAMPMENTS AND BATTLES, AS WELL AS APPEARING ON THE HISTORY CHANNEL AND THE LEARNING CHANNEL.
